American Bar Association Names Chamberlain Hrdlicka Shareholder Stewart Weintraub as Council Director

Section of Taxation Welcomes Attorney Stewart Weintraub

PHILADELPHIA (July 15, 2013) – The American Bar Association Tax Section has elected [Stewart M. Weintraub](#) of Chamberlain Hrdlicka as its 2013-2014 council director. The announcement was made at the ABA Tax Section's 2013 midyear meeting. Michael Hirschfeld, ABA chair-elect, welcomed Weintraub to the Council.

As council director, Weintraub will oversee ABA committee teams made up of exempt organizations, insurance companies, and state and local taxes professionals. He will participate in discussions and voting in addition to attending all Council and committee meetings. He will also provide final review of all comments the Section proposes to the government.

The ABA plays a significant role in proposing state and federal laws, reforming the court system, accrediting law schools, and evaluating the President's federal judge nominees.
